

ARAÚJO E POLICASTRO ADDS TWO

Brazilian firm Araújo e Policastro Advogados has strengthened its tax and real estate practice areas with the addition of two new partners – the latest stage of the firm’s aggressive hiring strategy in the run-up to its 50th anniversary next year.

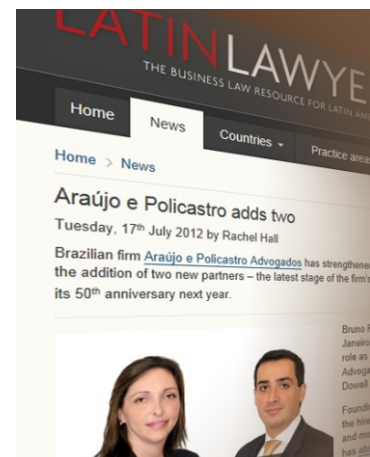

Faria, who specialises in tax litigation and holds an MBA in tax law, says he is
